



# The Feast of the Ephipany

On January 6, twelve days after Christmas, our church celebrates the Feast of the Epiphany. This feast day commemorates God's revelation of Himself to the world through the Incarnation of Jesus Christ. On Sunday, January 5, after the 10 a.m. service, we will celebrate the Epiphany with a pitch-in lunch and our traditional Epiphany cake.

The Gospel of Matthew tells the story of how the Wise Men brought three symbolic gifts to present to the infant Jesus: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Gold symbolized Jesu' kingship, frankincense represented his divinity, and myrrh foreshadowed his suffering and death. This event is considered a manifestation of Jesus to the Gentiles, signifying the universality of Christ's message.

Epiphany, also known as Three Kings Day, marks the end of the Christmas season in many cultures, as it falls twelve days after Christmas. It also serves as a reminder of the universal nature of Jesus' message and the importance of recognizing him as both divine and earthly. And, it highlights the act of giving and generosity, as the Wise Men brought gifts to honor the newborn Jesus.
